INTRODUCCIÓN

Do you know the difference between England, Great Britain, the United Kingdom and the British Isles? We often say England when we refer to Great Britain or the United Kingdom.

Sure you are familiar with some symbols and facts about the UK but do you really know what they mean and where to find them? What do you know about this country whose language you have been studying for years?

Here you will learn about a country full of images and curious traditions... Off we go!

Working on this webquest you will explore The United Kingdom and Ireland: England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Ireland.

Each team must investigate the region's landmarks, monuments or areas of interest, traditions and create an oral presentation.

TAREA

In groups of 4-6 you will have to work together to answer the questions given in the trivia quiz and then, you will have to create a power point presentation to introduce your classmates to the topic you have chosen. This power point presentation will be shown and explained in class and you will be evaluated both individually and as a group. As each student is responsible for one aspect, you should divide the work and presentation into different parts, for example:

- Geography and typical symbols or aspects of each country
- Government, money, religion and society

- Customs and traditions
- Culture and Images associated to England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland or Ireland.

After your presentations, you and your classmates may be asked to do some of the following quizzes to check your level of comprehension and understanding.


