New case of domestic violence in Spain

The police take a youth from Valencia into custody after the parents of his girlfriend reported him for domestic violence.

It was the parents of M.C., a minor, who reported the youth. They had noticed that her behaviour had changed since she had started seeing her new boyfriend.

"She didn't talk to anyone."
"She stopped seeing her friends." "She wouldn't put away her phone and was on it all day." These are some of the comments made by M.C.'s mother, the first person to notice her change in behaviour.


"M.C. met her boyfriend online, on a social networking site. They talked every day until R.A. managed to arrange to meet her and then she fell under

his spell. They met, started going out together and then he turned her against her friends and family, which is the typical behaviour of individuals with this type of profile", confirmed the police officer (L.A.) in charge of the investigation.

M.C. believed she had everything under control until the day R.A. lifted a hand to her because he saw that she had had a conversation with a friend on Whatsapp. He accused her of cheating on him, insulted her and hit her. "When she got home I didn't think twice. I knew I had to report him", M.C.'s mother told us with tears in her eyes.

Now R.A. is at the disposition of the domestic abuse court in Valencia. Miradas (The Association of Women Victims of Domestic Abuse) recommends being aware of this type of abusive behaviour, which can occur in underage couples on social networking sites, and reporting it as soon as possible, so that, as in this case, it can be detected and stopped in time.





I follow this advice to avoid sextorsion:	1	2	3
I know that my online conversations can be recorded.			
Never take intimate photos or make compromising videos or let people take or make them of you.			
Don't let yourself be fooled by strangers; appearances aren't always what they seem.			
Never share personal information online.			
Don't agree to the blackmailer's demands; it will only make them ask for more.			
Save the evidence! If the blackmailer threatens you, save the messages with the day and time they were sent.			
Cover your camera when you're not using it.			
Always use an anti-virus on your devices.			
Inform blackmailers that they are committing a crime and that you will report them.			
Use the options to report blackmailers on the social networking sites and on your apps if you are being blackmailed.			
If someone blackmails you, block them or delete them from your contact list.			
If you experience sextorsion, talk about it to a responsible adult and report it.			



A PARTNER WHO DOESN'T COMMIT DATING ABUSE IS A PARTNER WHO:

- 1. Treats me equally and respectfully.
- 2. Supports me in my decisions if they are right and helps me to reflect on them if they aren't.
- 3. Listens to my opinions.
- 4. Accepts that I have my own life.
- 5. Makes me feel good about myself.
- 6. Trusts me.
- 7. Doesn't control my conversations with others or who I go out with.
- 8. Doesn't try to control me by calling me or sending me messages constantly.
- 9. Isn't possessive or jealous.
- 10. Doesn't insult me or put me down.
- 11. Doesn't threaten me or attack me physicially, sexually or psychologically.
- 12. Doesn't control my appearance.
