REGULAR VERBS

Work – Worked (trabajar): I have worked today.
Play – Played (jugar): She has played tennis.
Clean – Cleaned (limpiar): He has cleaned the kitchen.
Visit – Visited (visitar): We have visited London.
Watch – Watched (ver/mirar): I have watched TV.
Cook – Cooked (cocinar): She has cooked dinner.
Study – Studied (estudiar): They have studied English.
Open – Opened (abrir): He has opened the door.
Close – Closed (cerrar): She has closed the shop.
Live – Lived (vivir): I have lived here for years.
Call – Called (llamar): She has called her friend.
Start – Started (empezar): We have started the lesson.
Finish – Finished (terminar): He has finished his work.
Help – Helped (ayudar): I have helped my mother.
Want – Wanted (querer): She has wanted a coffee.
Need – Needed (necesitar): They have needed help.
Like – Liked (gustar): I have liked the film.
Love – Loved (amar/encantar): She has loved the book.
Try – Tried (intentar): He has tried the cake.
Move – Moved (moverse/mudarse): We have moved house.



IRREGULAR VERBS

Be – Been (ser/estar): I have been tired.
Go – Gone (ir): She has gone home.
Do – Done (hacer): I have done my homework.
See – Seen (ver): He has seen the film.
Eat – Eaten (comer): We have eaten lunch.
Drink – Drunk (beber): She has drunk water.
Write – Written (escribir): I have written a letter.
Take – Taken (coger/tomar): He has taken the bus.
Make – Made (hacer): She has made a cake.
Buy – Bought (comprar): They have bought a car.
Find – Found (encontrar): I have found my keys.
Give – Given (dar): She has given me a gift.
Come – Come (venir): He has come late.
Run – Run (correr): She has run fast.
Speak – Spoken (hablar): I have spoken to the teacher.
Break – Broken (romper): He has broken the glass.
Choose – Chosen (elegir): They have chosen a book.
Begin – Begun (empezar): We have begun the class.
Drive – Driven (conducir): She has driven the car.
Know – Known (saber/conocer): I have known him for years.
