Information about the town:	<p>Our high school in Jerez:</p> <p>Our highschool is located about 2 km of the town center. This distance can be covered by public transport in around 10/15 minutes. Walking would take approximately 25 to 30 minutes.</p> <p>Our town: Jerez de la Frontera.</p> <p>Our town, in Southern Spain, is located in the province of Cádiz, Andalucía.</p> <p>It is the largest city in the province, with a population of around 200,000 people.</p> <p>Jerez is famous for the Sherry wine, flamenco and its Royal Andalusian School of Equestrian Art, world-famous for training Andalusian horses. Here, you could visit the Circuito de Jerez, which hosts MotoGP races and other motorsport events.</p> <p>Among its most important events and festivals, we have the Horse Fair in May, (a week-long festival with horses and</p>



dancing), and the **Semana Santa** (Holy Week), (its major religious festival with amazing processions)

You have to visit the **Alcázar**, a Moorish fortress from the C11th, the beautiful baroque and gothic style **Cathedral**, the **Tabancos**, traditional taverns where you can enjoy sherry and live flamenco performances...

Jerez de la Frontera is surrounded by some fascinating places to explore. Here are a few recommendations:

El Puerto de Santa María: Just a short drive away, this charming town is known for its beautiful old town and lovely beaches.

Sanlúcar de Barrameda: Famous for its sherry production and stunning beaches, it's a perfect spot for a relaxing day by the sea.

Chipiona: This coastal town offers beautiful beaches and a wonderful lighthouse.

Arcos de la Frontera: A picturesque white village perched on a cliff, known for its beautiful views and historic charm.

Seville: About an hour's drive away, Seville is a must-visit for its rich history, stunning architecture, and flamenco culture.

Jerez is a culinary treasure trove! Here are some dishes you have to try:

Gazpacho, a classic Andalusian cold soup, perfect for hot summer days. It's made, mainly, from raw vegetables and has a refreshing flavor.

Berza Jerezana: A stew with chickpeas, vegetables, pulled pork, and chorizo, perfect for cold days.
