1. By car

#### 2. By train (Nuremberg) and plane

Duration: 4h 50min

Advantage: Short trip

**Disadvantage:** High CO<sub>2</sub> - emission, expensive

#### 3. By bus

**Duration:** 12h 25min

**Kilometers:** 660 km



**Costs:** 35-71 €

Advantage: cheap

Disadvantage: CO<sub>2</sub> - emission, long trip, uncom-

fortable

#### 4. By train

**Duration:** 11h

Kilometers: 650 km

**Costs:** 109– 168 €

Advantage: environmentally friendly

Disadvantage: long trip, expensive

Our recommandation is the last offer. It's the best way to travel sustainably from Amberg to Bergamo. Trains have by far the best Co<sub>2</sub> emissions because they're mainly run by electricity. Of course travelling by bike would be even better for the environment but in this case it would take too long and you'd be way to exhausted after bicycling so long.


