Her parents were both intellectuals involved in the **social sciences** and political activism.

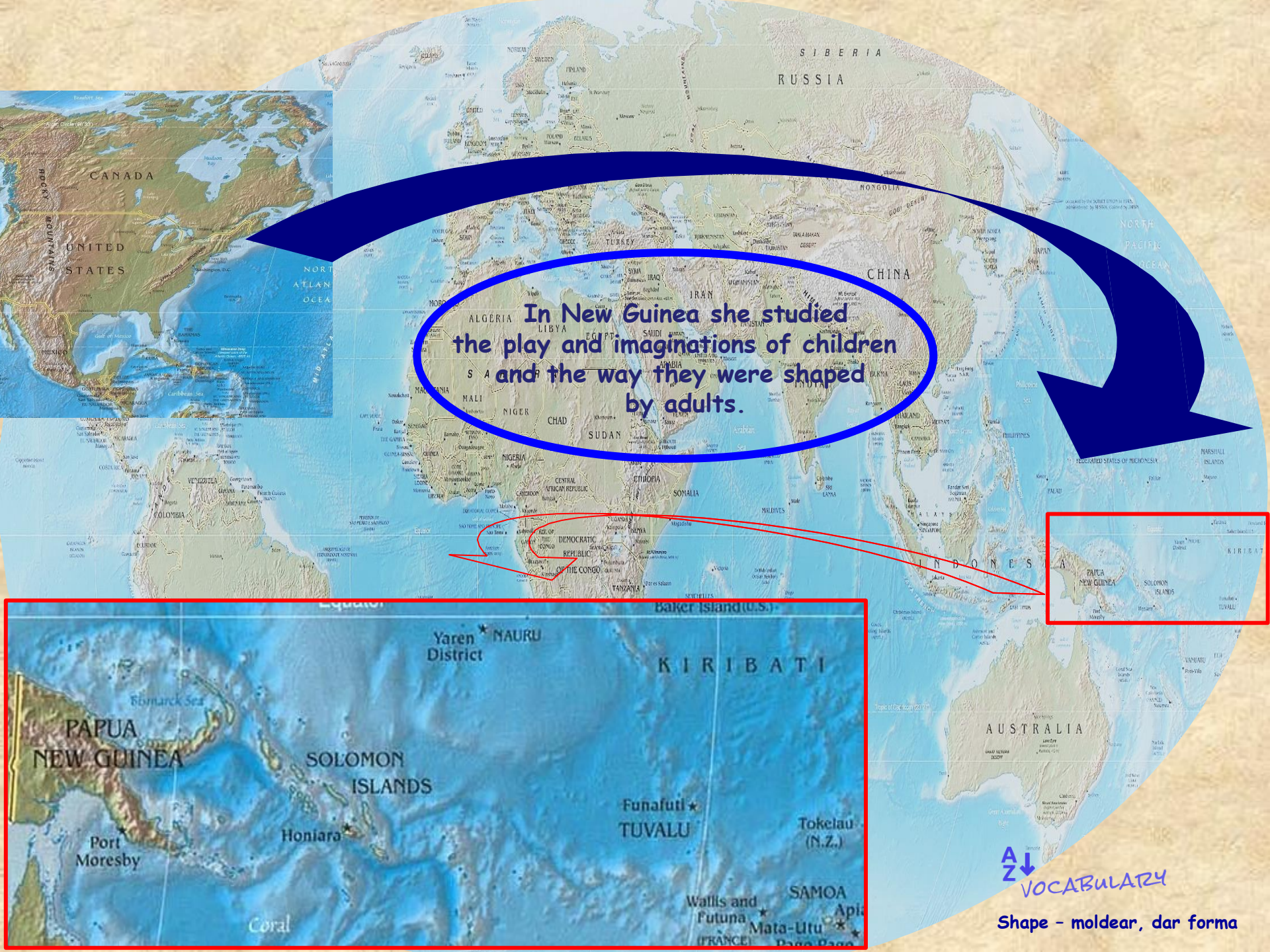
She first studied Psychology but went on to earn a Phd and become famous in the field of cultural Anthropology.

Psychology is the scientific study of the ways that people think, feel, and behave

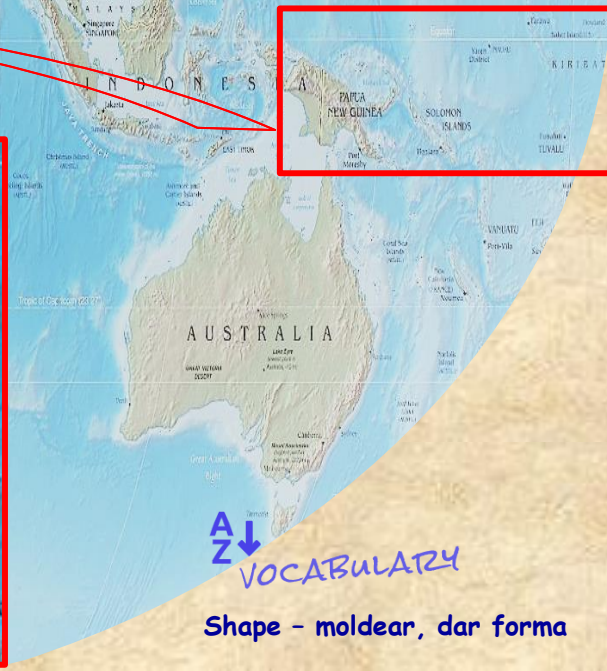
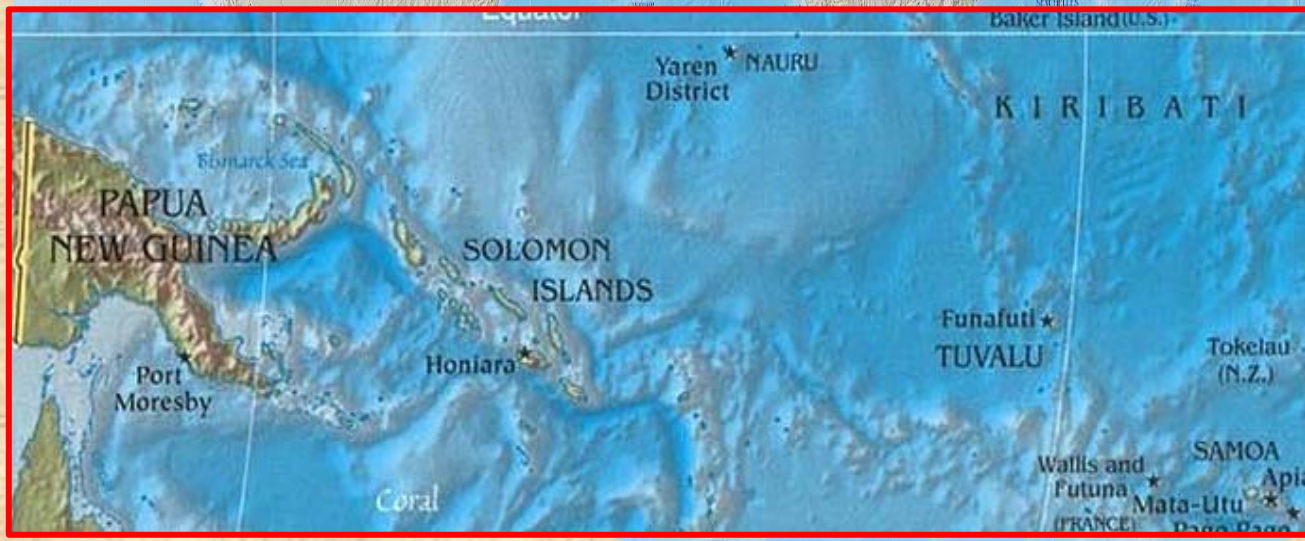

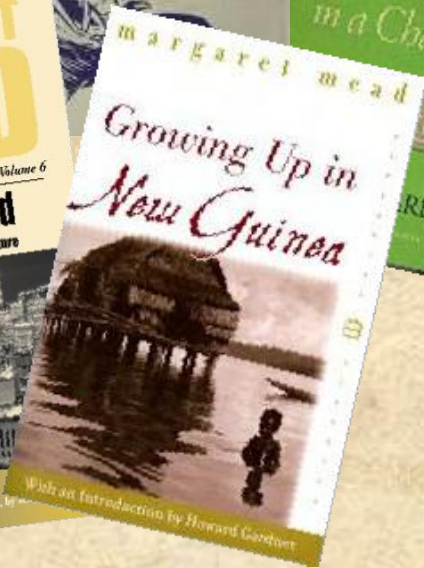
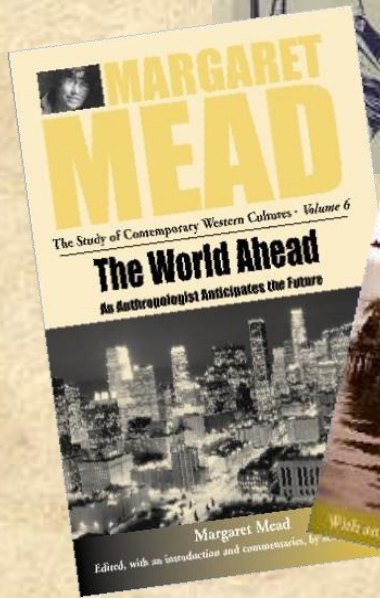
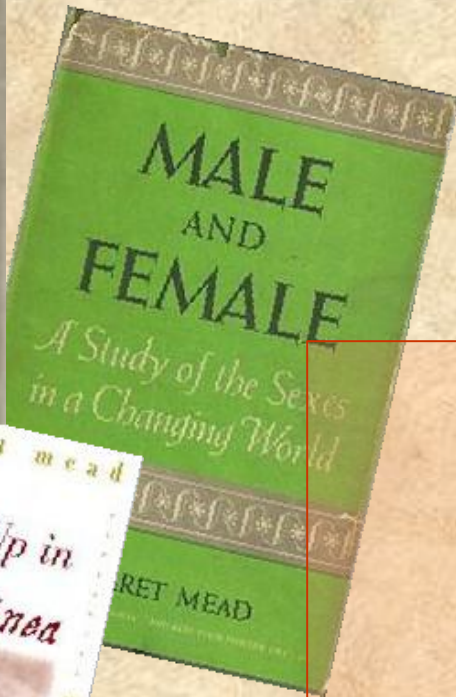
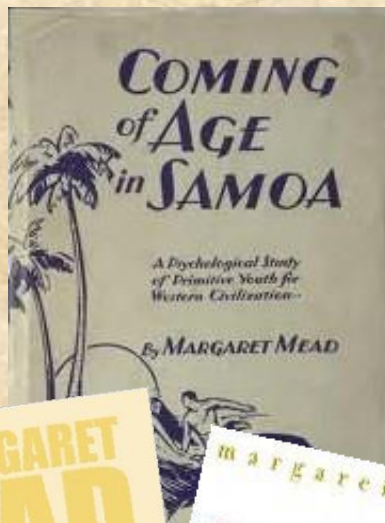


In New Guinea she studied

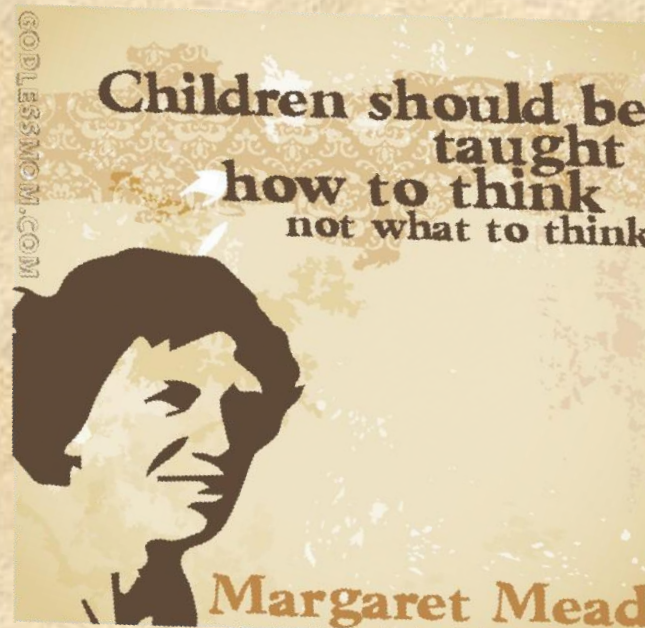
