Treaty of Paris 1763

- Beginning of Britain's Dominance in North America
 - Taxes
 - Reforming Colonial Administration
 - Placing Troops

Boston Tea Party

December 16th, 1773



Political and Mercantile protests against taxation on the colonies.

Protestors boarded British ships and dumped tea into the sea

Represented taxation without representation in the British Parliament

Created American resentment and was one of the events that led to the War of Independence

British Parliament then enacted the Intolerable Acts:

- 1 - Closed Boston Port
- 2 - Took away self-governance
- 3 - Quartered soldiers in American barracks and in public housing

Continental Congress

Meeting of representatives of the British Colonies that eventually became the 1st federal government of the United States.

- Tried to repair the fraying relations with Britain while asserting colonists rights
- Trade boycott against British merchants
- Battle of Bunker Hill
- King George issues Proclamation of Rebellion in August 1775



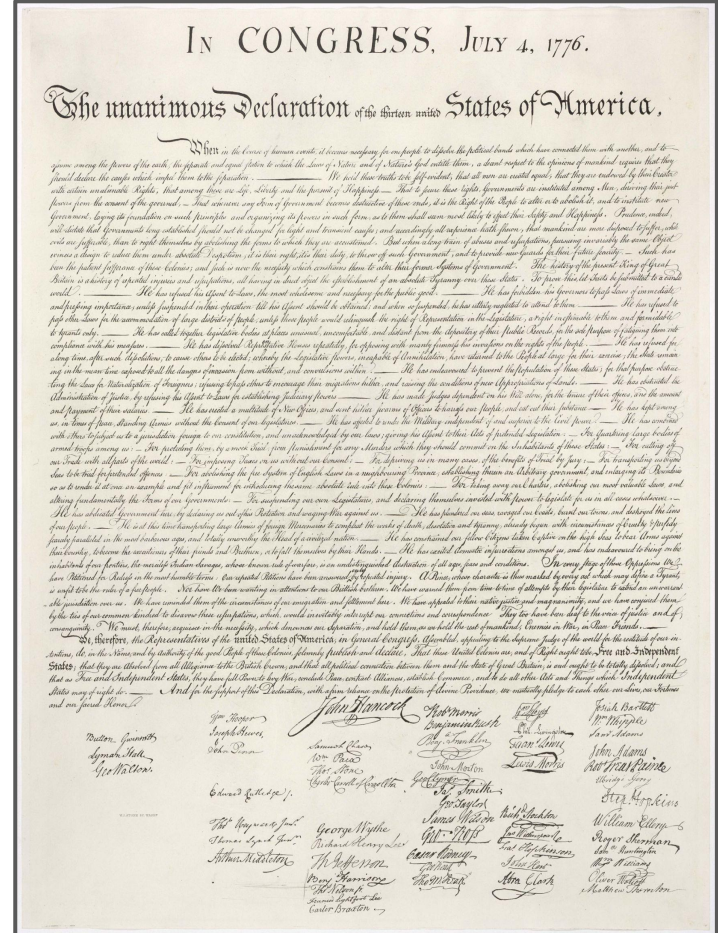
Declaration of Independence

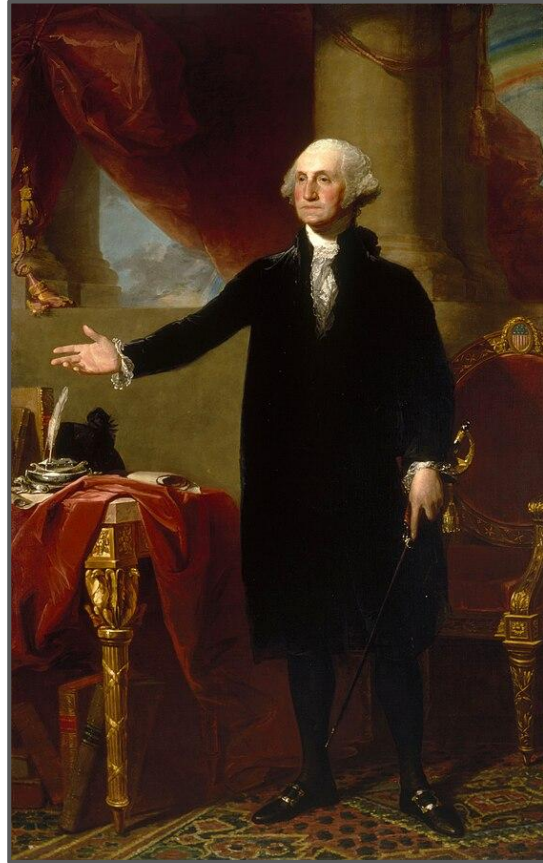
