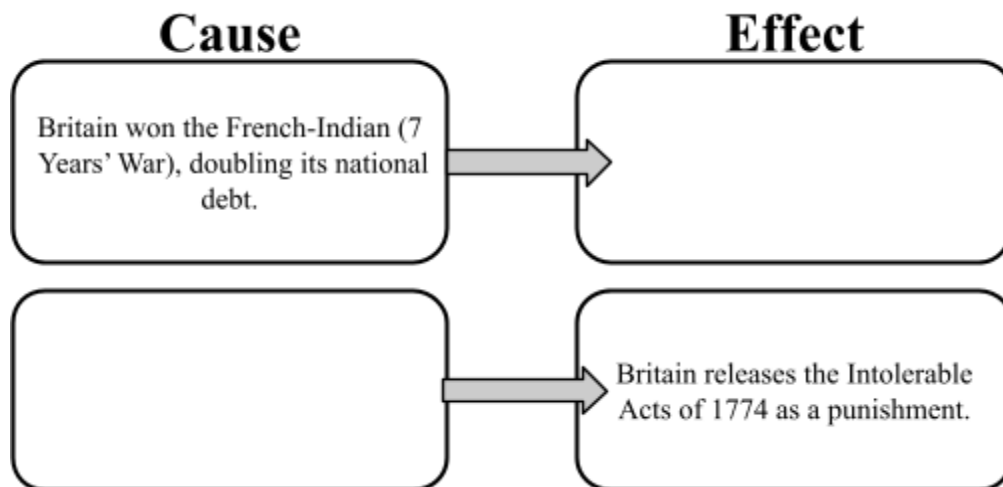


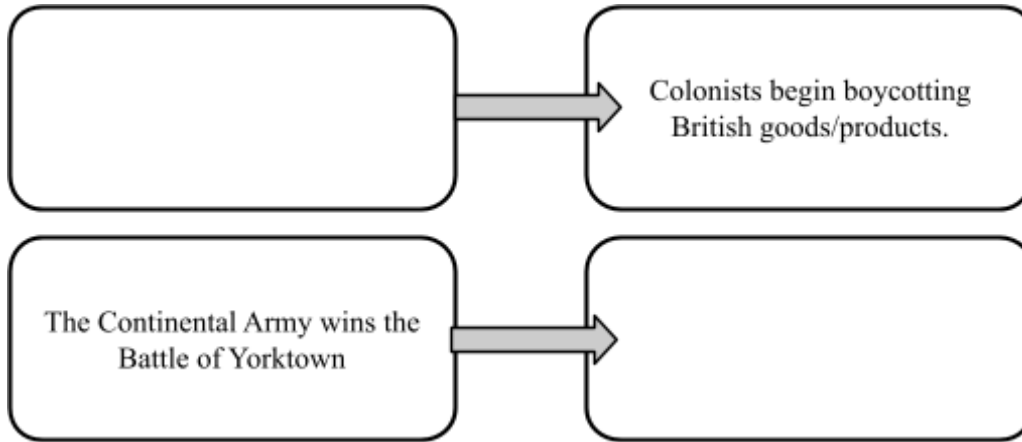

### B) Fill in the “Cause and Effects” below

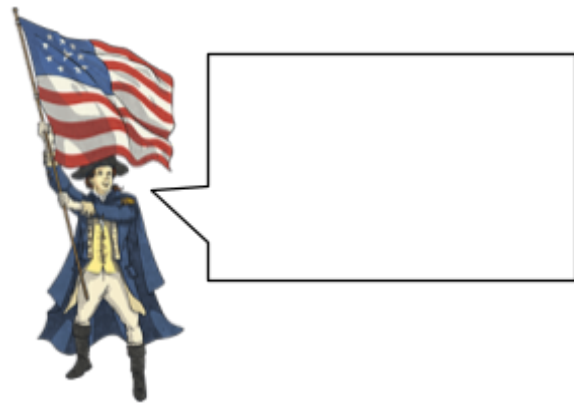
Missing phrases:

- The British army surrenders, giving victory in the war to the Continental Army. Three years later, the Treaty of Paris is signed, giving the United States independence from Britain.
- To retaliate against the Tea Act, a group called the “Sons of Liberty” threw British tea into Boston Harbor.
- Britain began passing Acts in the colonies such as the Stamp Act in order to tax the colonies and get more money and pay off its debt.
- The Intolerable Acts go into effect; colonists begin to lose rights.
